

NOTICE OF VACANCIES

The Cedar County Board of Supervisors is taking applications for various County board and commission appointments for the following year. Cedar County appreciates diversity in these appointments and welcomes all applicants at least 18 years of age. Terms and dates of appointments vary. These are unpaid positions. A brief description follows:

Board of Health: Five member board to provide guidance and oversee operations of County Public Health Department. The term of the appointment is three years.

Conservation Board: Five member board to provide guidance and oversee operations of County Conservation Department. The term of the appointment is five years.

Eastern Iowa Regional Housing Authority: A board to meet the housing needs of low to moderate income families and the elderly. The Board is composed of representatives from Delaware, Dubuque, Jackson, Jones, Clinton and Cedar Counties. Cedar County may appoint two Commissioners. The term of the appointment is two years.

Veteran Affairs Commission: Five member commission to provide guidance and oversee operations of Veteran Affairs Department.

Planning & Zoning Commission: Five member board to review and enforce County Zoning Ordinances and make recommendations on any proposed changes to same. The term of the appointment is three years.

Commission to Assess Damages (Eminent Domain Commission): 28 member commission representing realtors, farmers, bankers, auctioneers and city property owners to be available to the Chief Judge of the Judicial District to assess damages to property taken by eminent domain. The term of the appointment is one year.

This list is not all inclusive. The Board of Supervisors is always looking for people interested in serving their county. Applications are required and can be obtained at the Office of the Cedar County Auditor. The deadline for submitting applications is December 15, 2011. State law requires political subdivisions to make a good faith effort to balance most appointive boards, commissions, committees, and councils according to gender by January 1, 2012, and each year thereafter.
